## Summer 2017 National Grange Chiller

Thursday August 3rd started out like any other August day in Washington D.C. —hot, humid, steamy, busy. about 1 p.m. everything changed with a loud bang. The 22-year-old chiller system in our National Grange building ruptured a refrigerant tube, flooded the units, and died.

Immediately the building began warming up and we scurried to address the problem of temporary AC until the chiller system can be replaced (which will take about a month.) Bringing temporary chillers in and hooking them up - an absolute necessity in DC, and no alternative could be found— a cost of \$65,000 up front. Contractors worked all weekend to have temporary AC working by Monday afternoon. Thank you to Stephanie Tiller and Stewart for their extra hard work in helping to address this situation, and to all our great staff for their assistance and ideas.

Permanent system replacement rough estimate at this point is \$450,000. Also to be considered is the boiler system, which is a few years older than the chiller and could also quit at any moment.

# Grange gets ready to party in D.C. style

For our 150th birthday on December 4, 2017, the National Grange will hold a D.C.-style Gala. The event is set to raise the profile of our organization by reminding power players from across industry, coalitions and organizations and members of Congress about the accomplishments of the Grange over 150 years and the power of our grassroots network. It will also serve as a major fundraiser.

The black-tie optional, \$150 per plate evening event will take place at the historic Decatur House located directly next door to the Grange headquarters.

The event was originally envisioned as a complete "ask out" campaign where we raised nearly all the money from people who are not part of our membership, giving Grangers a chance to see an influx of capital from somewhere other than their own pockets. However, the chiller set back will require us to both ask out - and to a very wide circle - and ask in. It's imperative to have these businesses and organizations as well as Washington insiders and



members of Congress and the administration understand that the Grange is vital, vibrant and proud. To get the large donors to open their budgets a little wider for us, they have to know that our grassroots is engaged so they can see the value of investing their own capital to become partners in our fight for issues like rural broadband deployment and crop insurance protection.

Every member can become a sponsor for just \$25 and every Grange for \$50 and see their name listed in the program. More details about sponsorship is available on the following pages.

Now more than ever, every dollar counts. While Grange dues and building revenue will be used to pay the bill for the chiller, money raised through the gala will help us continue operations for members and other advocacy work during this very tight time. The National Grange Executive Committee has been working with an architectural engineer to take a look at our building for the long term and identify improvements that could be made to make it more attractive to tenants and more efficient to operate.

Our location, around the corner from the White House, is extremely attractive, but if the offices are dingy and dated, that may outweigh the benefits of location.

Paint and carpet have been updated regularly with tenant turnover, but we have the same 57-year-old single-pane, metal-framed windows and fluorescent light fixtures that could be made much more energy efficient if we had the funds to replace them.

At last November's Celebration Banquet I announced the kickoff of a Building Fund to be prepared for situations like this as well as other building upgrades. We did receive quite a few contributions but the total to date is far from enough to address the chiller crisis, let alone the other improvements. The Board is making plans to borrow money to address the chiller replacement and possibly the boiler.

Our building is not just steel and stone. It is our national Hall that brings in income per year of \$1.16 million (\$687,000 net) so we must keep our tenants happy and our facility operating efficiently. This income funds a major portion of our annual budget.

We would greatly appreciate your generous donations or those of your Granges toward this emergency that will cost more than a half million dollars. I know our building is a symbol to all of us of the importance of Grange to our country and to us. We need to keep it operating at peak efficiency and dependability. Thank you for your support!




The deadline to earn the 2017 Awareness Award is fast approaching. So if you would still like to participate and earn the award here is what you can do:

### 2017 Lecturer's Program in a Box

Alone, any Lecturer can only create so much, find so many experts and come up with so many ideas, but with more than 2,000 Lecturers around the country, there are innumerable opportunities for great programs to be shared around the Grange nation.

This program is open to any Lecturer at any level of the Grange. Lecturers may engage other members or non-members to assist in the creation of the program but must have contributed to its creation, editing and presentation. All programs should be presented at a Grange meeting before submission.

#### Rules

- 1. The Lecturer's Program in a Box (Program) entry must be submitted as a .ppt file by email to <a href="lecturer@nationalgrange.org">lecturer@nationalgrange.org</a> by October 31, 2017 for judging. You may choose to create this program on any presentation software, including Keynote, Prezi or others, but please convert and save to .ppt.
- 2. Program must have a title slide.
- 3. Program must have at least 10 content slides.
- 4. The last slide of the Program must include the name of the Lecturer who is submitting the program, the date and Grange information (name, number and state) where the program was presented and names of any contributors to the program.
- 5. Submission must include sample notice to the community (flyer, media alert) on how to promote the program to the broader public.
- 6. Program must include in the .ppt file, or as a stand-alone document at least two of the following:
  - Suggested activity (during Grange meeting or directly following)
  - Suggested further reading/viewing list
  - Word search or crossword (saved as PDF)
  - Song lyrics, Poem or other creative work to engage audience
  - Video or audio clip
  - Fact Sheet (saved as PDF)
  - Game suggestion
  - Sample letter to elected official (as PDF)
  - Other tool or idea to engage audience with the presentation during the meeting or as a Grange thereafter

All programs submitted by the deadline will be blind-judged by a panel. All Lecturers who submit a program will receive a certificate of participation. All submissions given a "Quality" or "Outstanding" or "Exceptional" rating will be compiled into a document and distributed electronically to Grange Lecturers as well as placed on the National Grange website.


### Ratings

- To receive an Outstanding rating, your program must have an 85 points or higher average across all judges.
- To receive an Exceptional rating, your program must have a 95 points or higher average across all judges.
