

Members in California face losses from wildfires, see fraternal outpouring

The devastating fires in California have affected many of the California State Grange members. Fortunately, so far, no Grange halls have been lost. But that can change at the whim of the winds driving the fires.

Many members have lost their homes, ranches, vineyards, crops, pastures and animals. In most cases, all that is standing is a chimney and a burned out shell of a vehicle.

This firestorm has consumed acres and acres of land, thousands of houses and caused more than 30 deaths. Hospitals have been evacuated. Whole neighborhoods, hotels, shopping centers and restaurants have burned to the ground. People had to literally run for their lives at a moment's notice with just the clothes on their back. Years and years of memories are gone.

Granges in Butte, Sonoma, Mendocino, Lake, and Contra Costa Counties have stepped up to help. They are hosting evacuees, helping with pets, preparing meals, hosting benefits, and serving as Public Safety command posts.

Some miracles have occurred - Sarah Nielson, a third-generation Grange member of Redwood

Valley Grange boarded her horses at a Grange member's house. As the members were running for their lives, they let the horses out of the corral. Unfortunately, the horses ran directly into the fire. Sarah and her husband, heartbroken at the loss, were escorted back to the area by Animal Services to see what, if anything, could be done. They searched the area and eventually located the horses, together and alive, in a small patch of green grass surrounded by charred vegetation. Sarah and her husband walked the horses three miles to where the California Highway Patrol helped them obtain a horse trailer, transporting the animals to the vet. After being checked out, the vet advised the horses were remarkably unharmed. But now, Sarah faces the issue of where to hold her horses and how to feed them since her winter hay was also lost in the fire.

Many Grange members find themselves in immediate need. Insurance may cover some losses, but that process takes time in this type of a disaster. And there are many things that insurance will not cover.

A special fund to assist those who have been affected by the wildfires in California has been created in the Grange Foundation.

- 2. State Lecturers are responsible for overseeing the photography contest within their respective states. State Lecturers shall complete, sign and return the Submission Form as verification of eligibility for the photograph/s representing their state.
- 3. Each participating State Grange is responsible for delivering their Photography Showcase submission/s to the National Grange convention and for getting them back home.
- 4. To be exhibited, a Submission Form for each Photography Showcase submission must be received by the National Lecturer by October 31, 2017.
- 5. To be judged, all Photography Showcase submissions must be received by the National Lecturer by 12:00 noon on Tuesday, November 7, 2017.
- Each Photography Showcase submission will receive a participation ribbon. In addition, a first, second and third place will be awarded in each division. First place will receive a rosette ribbon and \$50; second place will receive a rosette ribbon and \$30; and third place will receive a rosette ribbon and \$20.
- 7. Remember that all photographs are representing their State Grange. Any photograph deemed inappropriate will not be exhibited in the National Grange Photography Showcase.

Alone, any Lecturer can only create so much, find so many experts and come up with so many ideas, but with more than 2,000 Lecturers around the country, there are innumerable opportunities for great programs to be shared around the Grange nation.

This program is open to any Lecturer at any level of the Grange. Lecturers may engage other members or non-members to assist in the creation of the program but must have contributed to its creation, editing and presentation. All programs should be presented at a Grange meeting before submission.

Rules

- 1. The Lecturer's Program in a Box (Program) entry must be submitted as a .ppt file by email to lecturer@nationalgrange.org by October 31, 2017 for judging. You may choose to create this program on any presentation software, including Keynote, Prezi or others, but please convert and save to .ppt.
- 2. Program must have a title slide.
- 3. Program must have at least 10 content slides.
- 4. The last slide of the Program must include the name of the Lecturer who is submitting the program, the date and Grange information (name, number and state) where the program was presented and names of any contributors to the program.
- 5. Submission must include sample notice to the community (flyer, media alert) on how to promote the program to the broader public.
- 6. Program must include in the .ppt file, or as a stand-alone document at least two of the following:
 - Suggested activity (during Grange meeting or directly following)
 - Suggested further reading/viewing list
 - Word search or crossword (saved as PDF)
 - Song lyrics, Poem or other creative work to engage audience
 - Video or audio clip
 - Fact Sheet (saved as PDF)
 - Game suggestion
 - Sample letter to elected official (as PDF)
 - Other tool or idea to engage audience with the presentation during the meeting or as a Grange thereafter

Submissions & Uses

All programs submitted by the deadline will be blind-judged by a panel. All Lecturers who submit a program will receive a certificate of participation. All submissions given a "Quality" or "Outstanding" or "Exceptional" rating will be compiled into a document and distributed electronically to Grange Lecturers as well as placed on the National Grange website.

Ratings

- To receive a *Quality* rating, your program must have a 70 points or higher average across all judges.
- To receive an **Outstanding** rating, your program must have an 85 points or higher average across all judges.
- To receive an *Exceptional* rating, your program must have a 95 points or higher average across all judges.

2017 Evening of Excellence

PARTICIPANT GUIDELINES

- 1. The Best of Show entry from each State Grange will be eligible to perform at the Evening of Excellence held at the National Grange Convention. States are entitled to select their Best of Show winner as they choose. Best of Show participation is limited to one act per state.
- 2. State Lecturers are responsible for overseeing the talent competition within their respective states. State Lecturers shall complete, sign and return the Registration Form as verification of eligibility for the act representing their state.
- 3. State Lecturers are also responsible for returning signed Permission, Release, Hold Harmless and Indemnification forms from each participant. If any member of an act does not complete and sign this form prior to the start of the Evening of Excellence, the entire act will not be allowed to perform. Any participants under the age of 18 must have a parent's signature on this form.
- 4. Each state entry at the Evening of Excellence will receive \$100 toward expenses. If the act is a group, the check will be written to the leader and it is the responsibility of the group members to determine how the funds are distributed.
- 5. All acts will be held to a 5:00 minute time limit. This includes time to set up and take down any props necessary for the act. There is no minimum time limit.
- 6. If the act is using accompanying music on CD, both the CD and the CD case must be labeled with the participant's name or name of the act so that it can be easily identified and returned after the program.
- 7. Once again, the vocal, instrumental and variety acts as well as the public speeches will be judged by the audience using a live-voting app. The sign-a-song acts will be judged by a panel selected because of their knowledge of ASL/Pidgin Sign Language. Winning acts in each category will receive \$50 and a certificate. All other acts will receive certificates.
- 8. Remember that all acts are representing their State Grange, and presentation is a major component of any performance, so please dress and act appropriately. Any act deemed inappropriate will be stopped immediately.
