

2024-2025 Distinguished Community Grange Program Guidelines

The Distinguished Community Grange Program honors Community Granges that fulfill their responsibilities as part of the National Grange, while excelling in areas of membership, programming, and service to their communities. The 2024-2025 Distinguished Community Granges will be recognized for their work done from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025.

Distinguished Community Granges will be recognized each year at the National Grange Convention with a certificate, and a plaque for every five (5) years of achievement as a Distinguished Community Grange.

Submitting your Application

The postmark or online submission deadline by which to submit your application and all additional documentation for consideration is **September 1, 2025**. Application packets received after this deadline will not be considered.

You can choose any one of three ways to submit your application packet for Distinguished Community Grange:

Option 1 – Online

In addition to completing all the requirements above, you must also complete some or all the following, with points adding to 100 or more, to be recognized as a Distinguished Community Grange. To receive points, you must include supporting information, photos, or documentation for each item below with this application.

Maintain or increase membership. (20 points)
Members as of 7/1/2024
Members as of 6/30/2025
Achieve a net gain in your Junior Grange or Junior 1+ members. (15 points)
Members as of 7/1/2024
Members as of 6/30/2025
Host or organize a program on mental health for your Grange and the community. (10 points)
Invite a youth from another Grange, or from FFA, 4-H, Junior Fair Board, or other youth entity to speak at a meeting. (10 points)
Ensure that at least three (3) members (your Grange's subscription will count as one) are current subscribers to the National Grange quarterly magazine, <i>Good Day!</i> (10 points)
Submit a resolution to your State Grange on an issue other than Grange Growth or Grange Law (make sure your State Grange and/or the National Grange does not already have the same policy). (15 points)
Update your grange.org website with at least your meeting time, day, and location, and contact information for at least one officer OR contact the National Grange to have your grange.org website forwarded to your present website. The website must also include at least a few paragraphs about your Grange's mission and service to the community. You can count this if the information is up to date. (10 points)
URL for your website:



Establish or ensure your Grange's Facebook page is up to date (under the 'About' tab) with at least your meeting time, day, and location, and contact information. Ensure your page shows what your Grange does (events, service activities). (15 points)
URL for your Facebook page:
Host at least one (1) visit by a State or National Grange representative to your Grange and allow them to offer information/a message to your membership. (10 points)
Connect your membership with an element of Degree work, ritual, or history of the Grange. Take advantage of the Grange Heirloom Program. (10 points)
Host/organize at least three (3) community service or educational events. (20 points)
Preserve historical records, photographs, and artifacts of your Grange. (10 points)
—— Host a forum with public officials for your community to attend; OR hold a legislative event, candidate forum, or informational event on voting/elections; OR make at least one legislative issue contact with a public official at the local, state, or national level. (10 points)
Host at least one (1) Youth/Young Adult/Junior/Junior 1+ event or Youth and/or Junior community service activity. (10 points)
—— Hold an open house/public Grange event to introduce your Grange to the community and to engage in conversation about what unmet community needs the Grange may be able to assist with. (15 points)
Honor Veterans with a Patriot's Program or nominate a Veteran or active-duty service member for a Quilt of Valor and host the award ceremony. (10 points)
Incorporate the National Grange theme, "Grange Strong," into your programming, activities, and outreach. To learn more visit https://www.nationalgrange.org/national-grange-theme-2024-2025 . (15 points)
Take part in a community day or other event in your area where you have a booth or display that promotes your Grange's activities and provides membership information. (10 points)



Take part in a fair in your area where you have a booth or display that promotes your Grange's activities and provides membership information. (10 points)
Sponsor or host at least one (1) activity (i.e., Lecturer's program, community forum, one-day event) where you present members and the public with an educational "how to" of homesteading skills to promote agriculture. (10 points)
Have a fun and/or team building activity for your members that provides fellowship and builds camaraderie. (10 points)
Recognize and honor your members for their years of membership and service to the Grange. Also consider making fun awards (i.e., Best Dressed, Caretaker of the Kitchen). (10 points)
Provide at least one (1) press clipping, not from a Grange publication, showing you are publicizing your Grange, Grange events, or Grange members. (5 points)
Contribute at least \$100 to any fund in the National Grange Foundation. Donations can be made electronically at https://grangefoundation.org or make checks payable to: Grange Foundation. (10 points)
Submit to the National Grange Communications Director (pvonada@nationalgrange.org) at least one (1) article OR photos with captions for inclusion in either Good Day! magazine or our monthly Grange Today newsletter. (10 points)
Sponsor a public event, sports team, or project. (20 points)
Submit the Distinguished State Grange application and all supporting information and documentation using the online form, www.nationalgrange.org/distinguished . (10 points)
