

2024-2025 Distinguished State Grange Program Guidelines

The Distinguished State Grange Program honors State Granges that fulfill their responsibilities as part of the National Grange, while excelling in areas of membership, programming, and service to their communities. The 2024-2025 Distinguished State Granges will be recognized for their work done from July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.

Distinguished State Granges will be recognized each year at the National Grange Convention with a certificate, and a plaque for every five (5) years of achievement as a Distinguished State Grange.

Submitting your Application

The postmark or online submission deadline by which to submit your application and all additional documentation for consideration is **September 1, 2025**. Application packets received after this deadline will not be considered.

You can choose any one of three ways to submit your application packet for Distinguished State Grange:

Option 1 – Online

| In addition to completing all the requirements above, you must also complete some or all of the following, with points adding to 100 or more, to be recognized as a Distinguished State Grange. To receive points, you must include supporting information, photos, or documentation for each item below with this application. |
| Ensure that every Community Grange in your State is physically visited by at least one State Grange officer, director, or deputy (or other State-authorized representative) OR quarterly contact is made via phone, email, or mail by a State Grange officer, director, or deputy with any Granges not visited in-person. (15 points) |
| Submit a Community Service report with at least 50% of your state's Granges (Pomona and Community) reporting. (10 points) |
| Promote at least two (2) National Grange contests and ensure at least one entry or statewide winner for each is submitted from your state. (10 points) |
| Host a workshop or publish a news article in your State Grange newsletter on mental health. (10 points) |
| Host a State Legislative Day OR have at least 25% of the Granges in your state hold a public legislative/activism forum, voter drive, or other legislative/citizenship event OR have at least one State Officer or designated member testify on behalf of the State Grange before a statewide legislative or regulatory body. (20 points) |
| Achieve a net regular membership gain for the State Grange. (20 points) |

| Organize or reorganize a Grange. (15 points EACH) |

| Use the National Grange database to submit quarterly reports. (20 points) |
| Preserve historical records, photographs, and artifacts of your State Grange. (10 points) |
| Host a Degree Day or ritualism workshop that explains the lessons of each Degree for your members. Take advantage of the Grange Heirloom Program. (10 points) |
| —— Host a State Junior Grange event OR have at least 50% of the Junior Granges or Granges with Junior 1+ members participate in a state or national-sponsored service project/program. (15 points) |
| —— Host a State Youth and/or Young Adult event OR send a Youth Ambassador, John Trimble Legislative Youth, Communication Fellow, or National Youth Officer to National Grange OR establish a partnership with another State Grange and send a Youth on a Grange Interstate Youth Exchange. (15 points) |
| Use your State Grange's website or social media, OR publish an op-ed, to promote a Grange issue. (10 points) |
| Ensure that every Grange in your State has at least one current subscriber OR that each Grange is subscribed to the National Grange quarterly magazine, <i>Good Day!</i> (10 points) |
| Produce one State Grange contest, program, or educational activity using the theme "Grange Strong" and distribute information to each of your Community and Pomona Granges. (15 points) |
| Take part in the National Grange Community Service project at National Session or projects suggested by the National Community Service Team. (10 points) |
| Contribute at least \$250 to any fund in the National Grange Foundation. Donations can be made electronically at https://grangefoundation.org or make checks payable to: Grange Foundation. (10 points) |



| Provide information to your State Grange membership on planned giving to the Grange Foundation through programming or a workshop at a state or regional event. (10 points) | |
